A NOTE FROM FATHER DENNIS ADDRESSING ANTI-CATHOLIC LETTER ON CARS AFTER MASS

One thing that should be expected of being Catholic in America is that we as a Church can be the object of ridicule, discrimination, bigotry and anti-Catholic rhetoric. It has been said that anti-Catholicism in America is one of the last acceptable forms of discrimination.

After the 9:15 Mass on November 5th, an anonymous person placed an eight page letter on all the cars surrounding Church. While people have asked if I know the source of the letter, it is clear that the author of the letter is unable to defend his comments since he did not sign the letter. It is easy to hurl insults while seeking shelter behind the cloak of anonymity. From parts of the letter, it appears to have come from the 7th Day Adventists community.

I am sure that it will probably not be the last time such things happen. As a Catholic missionary once told me "It is clear in some christian denominations if they could not bash Catholics they would have nothing to talk about." However, I would ask that our Catholic community keep the following points in mind:

First, we should receive such attacks as a sign of validation regarding our faithfulness to the Gospel. As St. Luke states in his Gospel: *Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way* (Luke 6:22-23).

Second, Catholics must be prepared to defend the Catholic faith. However, we do so with gentleness and in truth. The author of the letter quoted a lot of scripture but nearly all of it was quoted out of context. He uses a strategy called "proof-texting". This dubious method of understanding Sacred Scripture begins with a premise and then seeks to find scriptural proofs to fit his premise. In other words, he makes the scripture say what he wants it to say rather than what it actually means. We Catholics should continually prepare ourselves through constant study so that we not fall prey to deceitful practices. As St. Peter says: Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame (1 Peter 3:15).

Thirdly, be proud! You belong to the Catholic Church. Through it many have attained the heights of holiness and are great witnesses to the richness of our great tradition. On any given day, our Church feeds more people, educates more people, nurses and treats more people than any government, organization, or other church in the world. No other church, government program or organization has lifted whole generations out of poverty as quickly and efficiently as the Catholic Church has done in the past 100 years in our country. While the letter writer may reference the scandals of individuals in the Church throughout its history, the Church, as the Body of Christ, has remained incorrupt and ever-faithful. For that we have much to be proud.

So when it happens again (and it will happen again as it has for hundreds of years in our country), throw the letter away and offer a quiet prayer for the misguided author but also pray for your fellow Catholics who need strengthened in their faith.
